Dates are subject to change and will be updated each day. The projection for each area is from today up to the listed date. Please keep in mind that crews are working in all counties. The areas in which generation and transmission are available can receive power more quickly. Even in those counties where power has not yet been restored, our crews are working to remove trees and rebuild lines, so that those areas can receive power when generation and transmission are available.

Generation (The plants at which electricity is produced)

Transmission (The high-voltage grid that transports electricity long distances)

Distribution (Sam Houston EC's system, which delivers electricity to our members)

- Damages to Sam Houston EC distribution system and Entergy's transmission grid serving Liberty and Hardin counties were the most severe in our territory.
- We are working with Entergy to energize substations in that area today.
- Right of way clearing and line repairs have been in progress, and right of way work is complete.
- Some feeders along FM 321 have been energized.
- As crews are finishing repairs in other parts of the system, they are being moved to join those already working in Liberty and Hardin counties.

Now that transmission is available in the area, more power can be restored to more areas. We project that power will be restored in these areas over the next few days. We expect to return power to the most severe areas by Sept 26th.
